KIM MURPHY is assistant managing editor for foreign and national news. Murphy oversees a large network of Times bureaus across the U.S. and around the world. Murphy spent more than 25 years as a foreign and national correspondent, reporting from the Middle East, Russia, Afghanistan and Europe. She won the Sigma Delta Chi award for foreign correspondent for her work in the Middle East and the 2005 Pulitzer Prize in international reporting for her reporting from Russia.

MITCHELL LANDSBERG is deputy foreign and national editor for the Los Angeles Times, helping to supervise and edit the Times' network of national and global correspondents. In a career spent primarily with the Times and the Associated Press, he has reported from nearly every US. State and from abroad, including Moscow, China, Haiti, Israel, West Bank and Egypt.

CARLOS E. CORTÉS, Professor of History Emeritus, UC Riverside, received the World Affairs Council Local/Global Award for being a "mover and shaker" in Intercultural Communication.

ALEXANDRA ZAVIS is writer and editor on the Los Angeles Times' Foreign Desk who has reported from more than 40 countries. Zavis spent a decade with the Associated Press, reporting from Liberia, Sierra Leone, Congo, Sudan, Somalia, Iraq and Afghanistan, among other war-torn places. Since joining The Times in 2006, she has served as a Baghdad correspondent and as a California reporter covering poverty and veterans issues. She was awarded the American Academy of Diplomacy's 2014 Arthur Ross Award for distinguished reporting on foreign affairs.
